GLIF - Global Lambda Integrated Facility

GLIF Secretariat Sponsorship & Continuity of Funding

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- All running costs met from voluntary sponsorship from GLIF participants
- 22 organisations contributed amounts between EUR 500 & 10,400 for total of EUR 66,576 in 2012
- Probably around 60 participating organisations in GLIF
- Financial contributions have remained relatively stable, but balanced budget relied on subsidy from TERENA
- Limited success in attracting new sponsors (although PSNC added in 2012)
- Reserves depleted to 3 months funding (effectively 1 year's deficit)



Problems with existing scheme

- Reserves depleted to levels that endanger continued operation of GLIF
- Limited scope for additional activities to enhance and expand GLIF
- Difficult to calculate fair methods to raise revenue if costs increase and/or sponsors drop out
- Little consistency in contributions from organisation-toorganisation
- No guidelines on who should sponsor and how much
- No tangible benefits associated with sponsorship



Revision process

- Governance WG agreed following principles on 14 Sep 2012:
 - Develop more coherent sponsorship tiers
 - Develop guidelines as to what would be appropriate contributions for particular types of organisations
 - Look to increase revenue to develop range of activities
- New funding proposal drafted on 15 Aug 2012:
 - Discussed by WG Chairs and minor amendments suggested
 - Revised proposal circulated to existing sponsors in (early-) Sep 2012
- Several existing sponsors had suggested that higher contributions could be possible if more notice was provided and/or contributions were linked to a kind of membership



Proposed new scheme

- No decision or agreement has been made yet!
- Consent of sponsors is required!



Proposed new sponsorship categories

- International GOLE operator
 - Critical to connecting global communities
 - Typically has 4 or more international links
- National Lightpath operator
 - Serving country or territory (e.g. NREN)
 - Typically runs optical exchange
- Regional Lightpath operator
 - Serving region of country or territory (e.g. regional R&E network)
 - May or may not operate optical exchange or have international links
- Lightpath user
 - University or research institute with lightpaths



Linking sponsorship categories to units

- International GOLE operator = 6 units
- National Lightpath operator = 4 units
- Regional Lightpath operator = 2 units
- Lightpath user = 1 unit

- Add up units from sponsors (currently 80 units)
- Divide budget by total units to determine unit value
- Unit value determines recommended contribution



Sponsorship 2013

- Aim to collect EUR 80,000 for 2013
 - Cover EUR 63,300 operating budget
 - Allows for reduced contributions / loss of sponsors
 - Build up reserves
- EUR 80,000 ÷ 80 units = EUR 1,000 per unit
 - International GOLE operator = EUR 6,000
 - National GOLE operator = EUR 4,000
 - Regional GOLE operator = EUR 2,000
 - Lightpath user = EUR 1,000





- Some sponsors fall into more than category
 - Note sponsors placed in highest category in draft proposal
- Some sponsors don't fit into any particular category (e.g. CERN)
- Categories intended to be self-selecting and may be 'downgraded'
 - Note if too many sponsors select lower categories, unit value may need to increase
- Transitional period may be required
- Some rebate for hosts of Global LambdaGrid Workshops may be considered
